

Along the way you'll see many famous paintings that you can finish and add to, color in, or even change—any way you like.






As much as possible the works of art are organized according to their birthdays: the oldest ones are first, and the newest ones are at the end.


In the caves of Lascaux in France researchers have discovered the oldest pictures in the world. This one here is called the "Second Chinese Horse" and it's over 17,000 years old!


















Sometimes very old works of art can seem much newer than recent ones, don't you agree? This border from Peru is almost 1,900 years old.
